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Achievements versus Objectives

We broadly achieved our objectives set for the year 2017.

Highlights of 2017

Two events turned out to be unforgettable experiences: Our *Kids' Klown Parade* involved about 750 young people in a massive show of solidarity with hospitalised children and during *TeamFest* all our volunteers bonded with each other as a large family.

Our association showed steady and controlled growth in 2017:

More Klown Doctors, improved clown skills, more visits to children in hospital, sound finances, and an active Support

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Operating Results 2017 in numbers

Frequency of Hospital visits: 355, or 6.08 visits a week

Total **number** of children visited: **3,650** (approx.)

Total time spent by Klown Doctors in Hospital: 761 hours

Total training time of Klown Doctors: 1154 hours

(or an average of 38 hours per Klown)

We visit

Every child, Every week! Compared to 2016, the *frequency* of the visits went up substantially, but the planning and organisation of the visits changed: Klown Doctors now usually spend *slightly less time* in Hospital when they do their round of the wards; this means:

- The teams (consisting of 2 or 3 Klowns) visit 2 or 3 wards instead of 5 (as was the case previous years) for an average duration of 2.5 hours instead of 4 hours.
- But, since we have a larger group of Klowns available, they can go to Hospital more often and divide the 5 wards between them.

The result is a **win-win**: The Klowns can stay *longer in a room* if required for the benefit of the child, while at the same time the *total round* of wards is *less exhausting* for the Klowns. After all, our volunteers do their hospital rounds after a full day's work.

Finances

The financial situation of the association is healthy. The expenses for the year 2017 totalled 37,827.78 EUR, which were fully covered by the funds raised during events, the donations, sponsorships and MCCF-grant received.

Use of funds:

63% to Direct Operations: Training, coaching, props, team-building

19% to Awareness Building & fundraising expenses 18% to Administration and running of the NGO (IT, telecommunication, stationery, transport, printing, subscriptions, etc.)



Achievements compared to Objectives

Objective 1 set for 2017: *A moment that lasts a week!* or: Strengthen the quality of our clowning.

In April, the established Klowns (with a minimum of one year experience in hospital clowning) where introduced to new techniques and mindsets during the live-in seminar "Who let you in here?" led by John Wright, Director of the Wright School of Comedy in London, with a focus on the concept of playfulness (see picture above). John Wright is the author of the book Why is that so funny?

A further two-day programme about **Contact Clowning**, organised in September, was led by Ton Kurstjens, author of the book *The clown, from Heart to Heart (see picture on the right)*. Tom has been working as a clown all his life and trains hospital clowns as well as other interested groups. Special attention was paid to working with the actual situation as it is found in a hospital room, mainly meaning that a lot of importance is given to improvisation.



In 2017 the association made progress in ensuring its sustainability by registering as a Legal Person to protect the personal liability of the Committee members.

The dedication of the Support Team volunteers also ensures a smooth running of the association as the responsibilities are shared among each other and there's good mutual understanding.



People matters

We welcome **8 new Klown Doctors** in our midst, who obtained their Certificate on December 2 after training for more than a full year: Artistic skills, improvisation techniques, a live-in seminar on Hospital Clown Skills with Laurence Quetel (France / Netherlands) and a few months of visits supervised by established Klowns. They are now further coached individually on-the-job by a Maltese professional.

Highlights of 2017

15 October: The Kids' Klown Parade

TeamFest

Meeting Patch in person

A team of 8 representatives of Dr Klown Malta went on a mission to Padua, Italy, for a weekend to participate in training sessions and meet **Dr Hunter "Patch" Adams** in a Conference attended by 800 Clown Doctor enthusiasts.





They came back with a thousand good memories and a realistic view on the ideas and work of Patch Adams, who has developed more into a symbol of a movement for "love and peace" than a practical example of what we Klown Doctors try to achieve in hospital. Discussions went on till late in the night, and were very enriching experiences.

Dr Klown in Gozo

The Klown Doctors visit the Gozo General Hospital when called upon by local medical or nursing staff. With the certification in December of two Gozitan Klown Doctors, Dr Kuku and Dr Yippee!! the visits will increase and be more regular, to the benefit of the children in the Outpatients Ward.

We will also continue to organise team development meetings.

We will of course be receptive for new developments coming our way and participate wholeheartedly in events organized for Dr Klown. That will most probably keep us more than busy – but we are very grateful for all the support shown by so many!
